As non-stop commercial flights into PAFA from the lower 48 have increased sharply, so too have

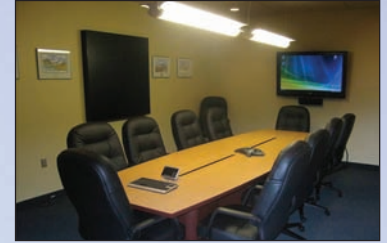

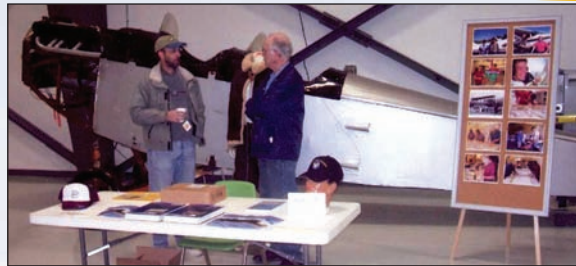
